AVIATION TRIVIA

Each Boeing 787 Dreamliner contains approximately 35 short tons (32,000 kg) of [carbon fiber reinforced plastic](#) (CFRP), made with 23 tons of carbon fiber.

Starting in 2013, the Airbus A380 maximum take-off weight is increased to 1,260,000 lbs. and has an additional 100 nautical miles in range.

The F-22 Raptor first flew over 15 years ago.

The United States plans to buy a total of 2,443 F-35 Lightning II aircraft to replace the F-16, A-10, F/A-18, and AV-8B.
